Submit your comments on the proposed rule
on Public Charge by December 19

Substantive comments with data & specifics on the chilling effect of the proposed changes to public charge, the negative consequences of loss of benefits, and the ways that clients and agencies have relied on previous regulations are most helpful. Agencies must respond to individual comments and show their work.

- Detailed Sector Template: for organizations who want to bring their unique expertise and perspective about a specific program, a specific population, or sector that will be harmed.
- Direct Service Provider Template: Share stories of what you're seeing on the ground.

Background

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has released a new proposal on public charge to rescind the 2022 public charge rule. Community Health Partnership is participating in the Protecting Immigrant Families (PIF) national campaign to respond as a movement and show strong opposition to another attack on immigrant families and communities.

What is Public Charge?

When applying for a green card, the application is reviewed by government officials. The “public charge test” is part of the review by government officials to see if an immigrant is likely to primarily depend on the government for support in the future. The public charge test is not part of all immigration applications. Under the current 2022 rule, most health, nutrition, and housing programs do not count against families in public charge decisions. What is the New Public Charge proposal?

On November 19, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) posted a new proposed rule on public charge, with comments due December 19. The proposal rescinds the 2022 public charge rules. Because of this removal, it is unclear what benefits are safe and not safe to use and whether family members’ use of benefits will not be counted. It describes the agency’s intent to provide future “policy and interpretive tools” that would guide USCIS officials as they use broad discretion. The proposal estimates that government spending on programs would decrease by \$9 billion each year due to reduced use by US citizens and lawful permanent residents, especially children.
